

Postdoctoral research fellowship opportunity

A full time postdoctoral position in the area of antisocial behaviour is offered. The fellowship is for 12 months with a possible second year appointment and provides a research and academic training.

Description

Data has already been collected through multiple projects. The postdoctoral fellow will lead and participate in the development of a series of scientific papers on risk and protective factors for antisocial behaviour that operate at different stages of life across the various studies conducted.

The goal is to expand and enrich the candidate's knowledge of antisocial behaviour and the scientific method, and to extend the candidate's skills in conceptualizing and executing statistical analyses and writing manuscripts for publication in high impact scientific journals.

Qualifications

Applicants must have a recent Ph.D. in a related discipline (e.g., Psychology, Psychiatry, Epidemiology, Sociology, Criminology), have a demonstrated record of experience in advanced quantitative statistical methods. Applicants must have demonstrated ability in preparing and publishing research papers. The applicant must be interested in pursuing a career that focuses broadly on mental health and antisocial behaviour, mental health and the law.

Environment

The position is to be held at the Department of Psychiatry of the Université de Montréal and the Institut Universitaire de Santé Mentale de Montréal Research Center, and is funded through a CIHR operating grant. Supervision will be assured by Professor Sheilagh Hodgins in collaboration with Professor Anne Crocker at McGill University, and the Douglas Mental Health University Research Center.

High quality, intensive supervision will be offered to ensure that the post-doctoral fellow achieves the goal of the position and develops all of the abilities necessary to become an independent scientist. Teaching and student (co)supervision opportunities will also be offered.

We are seeking to fill the position as soon as possible, applications will be reviewed immediately. Applicants are encouraged to submit by June 15th, 2016.
